PASTOR'S COLUMN

The month of February typically celebrates Valentine's Day, which we celebrate each year on February 14th. Valentine's Day was officially recognized by Pope Gelasius in 496 A.D. It has a long tradition of being associated with romantic love; however, in our modern age it has also become associated with anyone you care for. That could be parents, children, friends and co-workers.

The history of Valentine's Day is a bit sketchy but most historians would agree it is about a man named Saint Valentine. St. Valentine was a third century priest who performed marriage ceremonies against the will of the Roman Emperor Claudius II. While in jail he fell in love with the jailor's daughter. On February 14, 270 A.D., Valentine was executed. Before he was put to death, he wrote a letter to his beloved and signed it, "From Your Valentine." (His remains are in the Whitefriar Street Carmelite Church in Dublin, Ireland.)

Valentines Day, with its rather sketchy history, is truly a day honoring love and has been celebrated for centuries. For Christians, there is a day we have celebrated for centuries. One that is not sketchy. Every year we celebrate the resurrection of Christ, on Easter.

There is only one message in regard to the greatest love story. God loves you and Christ died to forgive you of your sins and provide a place in heaven if you will accept it as a free gift. That is the only message there is. We will be spend eternity in heaven with God for one reason and one reason only. It will not happen because we were good, bad, or indifferent. It will happen because we put our trust in Jesus Christ and Him alone for our salvation.
